Health Current Summit & Trade Show – Hybrid Event COVID-19 Health and Safety Protocol

We look forward to your participation in [ACHIEVE 2021](#) – the 14th Annual Health Current Summit & Trade Show in Glendale, AZ, October 12-13, 2021. To ensure the health and safety of everyone present, **Health Current is adopting a “Vaccination Required” approach for all in-person attendees, exhibitors, and staff members. This means that all attendees, exhibitors, and staff members participating in the Health Current Summit & Trade Show in person will need to provide proof of their COVID-19 “full vaccination” to attend. Anyone who cannot provide verification of their fully vaccinated status is invited to participate in the Health Current Summit & Trade Show using the virtual attendance option.**

- A person is considered **fully vaccinated** 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson’s Janssen vaccine. This guidance applies to all authorized and recommended COVID-19 vaccines by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.¹
- If an attendee, exhibitor, or staff member cannot meet these requirements, they are **NOT** considered fully vaccinated and will not be permitted to attend the Summit in-person.
- **To demonstrate proof of full vaccination** for right of entry to the Health Current Summit & Trade Show, Health Current will ask all registered attendees, exhibitors, and staff members to show their vaccination card on-site.
 - **You may bring your CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record with you; or**
 - **You may show proof of your vaccination card on your mobile device.**
- **As of July 27, 2021, the CDC has issued new guidance that Americans should consider wearing masks in indoor settings, even when fully vaccinated, in certain circumstances.**²
- **All attendees will be asked to wear masks in shared areas of the Renaissance Phoenix/Glendale Hotel & Spa, regardless of vaccination status accept when eating or drinking.**
